New teaching material after the Easter holiday

What if the schools stay closed after the Easter holiday?

Your child will then receive new teaching material to learn at home or at childcare. The teacher will repeat this teaching material in the classroom as soon as the schools reopen.

How long does your child work for school at home?

3 to 4 hours maximum per day.
It depends on how old your child is and how quickly he or she learns.

How can you help your child?

- Ask if your child understands everything. See if he or she can work further on his or her own. Please stay nearby so you can answer questions. There's no need for you to teach your child yourself.
- Help with tasks for a maximum of 2 hours a week.
- Create a plan with fixed moments for school work. For example, your child works for school every weekday from 10 a.m. to 12 noon and from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. at the latest. At other times your child can read, exercise, play, chat with friends, etc. This gives your child peace and structure.
- Does your child find it difficult to learn at home? Contact the class teacher or class supervisor. You can discuss solutions together.

What does the school do?

- The school examines which new teaching material your child needs for the next school year.
- The school helps you if you have any questions.
- The school lets you know if there are other government measures.
- The school lets you know when lessons will be held via the computer.
- The school lets you know how well your child is learning the teaching material. Your child will then take a test or participate in a quiz.
- The school must ensure that every student can continue to learn. A few examples: your child must also be able to learn at childcare. Or does your child not have his or her own computer? Let your school know. They will look with you at how they can offer the teaching material.
